

Worship the Lord your God, and serve only him. Luke 4.8



#### Rev'd John's Sermon Outline

#### Lenten Introduction: Joel 2:1-12

An exhortation to Gods people to 'return to Him with all our heart with fasting, weeping and mourning'.

#### Text: Luke 4: 1-15 - .. Lessons from Jesus in the Wilderness

\*vs 1-2 - Jesus, filled with the Holy Spirit.

A follower of Jesus being filled by the Holy Spirit is empowered to live a life, being submitted to God and lingering in His presence - enabling us to deal with temptations.

\*vs 3-4 The first temptation: physical needs 'turn stones to bread'

Satan suggests Jesus uses his power for personal gain which is NOT God's will.. Human life is not sustained by bread alone, but by reliance on God's word.

\*vs 4-5 -8 the 2nd temptation -

'If you worship me ....'- I will give you the kingdom of the world.'

Jesus' response: Thou shalt worship the Lord YOUR GOD and Him shall you serve! \*vs9-13 3rd Temptation. Jesus quotes from PS 91 :11-12 - to put ourselves under

God's protection and NOT put oneself in unnecessary danger.

Application: Jesus Victory over temptation was through God's word- 'IT IS WRITTEN' encouraging us to do the same.

\* A Call to Action: let us therefore resolve to actively study the Bible and seek God's guidance to withstand temptations in our lives\*.

Eph 6:17 - the sword of the Spirit - The Word of God is our weapon of defence when we face temptation being empowered by the Holy Spirit..

\*Let us embrace the example of Jesus and know, and inwardly digest scripture and use it with effect.
